

## **FEDERAL FUNDS AT WORK IN HAMILTON COUNTY SCHOOLS**

**Title I, A (Basic):** Provides funding based on district poverty level that is used to focus on improving instruction in order to increase student achievement. Supplemental services and materials are provided to students in the areas of reading, mathematics, and writing. Title I funds also provide for assistance with instructional staff becoming highly qualified and to provide scientifically based professional development to improve teacher effectiveness and increase student engagement. Title I funds are supplemental to state and local funds. For the 2009-10 school year, Supplemental Educational Services (SES) are provided at each of the district elementary schools to eligible students for after school tutoring through private providers. Title I funds are used to target students in grades K – 6 in the Hamilton School District.

**Title I, C (Migrant):** Provides assistance to students who are academically challenged due to frequent mobility and lifestyle. The families of these students are also eligible for services.

**Title I, D (Neglected and Delinquent):** Provides funding for students in the district DJJ facility and students at the high school who have been identified as at risk of dropping out of school.

**Title II-A (Teacher and Principal Training):** Assists school districts in preparing, recruiting, training, and retaining high quality teachers and principals.

**Title II-D (Enhancing Education Through Technology (EETT)):** Provides digital learning environments, empowers teachers to integrate technology to improve students' rates of learning, expands access to innovative digital technologies and learning opportunities, and provides the infrastructure that supports high-speed connections to the point of learning. Technology based lesson plans and network maintenance services are also provided with these funds.

**Title III:** Provides assistance for the improvement of the education of immigrant and limited English proficient students.

**Title IV, A (Safe and Drug Free Schools):** Provides for instruction and counseling in the prevention of violence and abuse of tobacco, alcohol, and other drugs.

**Title VI (Rural):** Provides additional funding for students in rural and low income districts.

**Title X (Homeless):** Provides assistance to students and families who are identified as homeless in the McKinney Vento program.

**IDEA, Part B: IDEA, Part B, Preschool; and IDEA, Part B, Discretionary Supplement:** IDEA Part B and Preschool provides supplemental funds for identified special students. IDEA is also supplemental funding for students with disabilities ages 3 to21.
