In this activity we will be looking around our environment (inside \& outside our homes) to find the different types of lines we've discussed in class.

First: You will need a piece of paper and a pencil. Write down as many types of lines that you can remember. In class, we talked about many different types of lines. So, think about how they can be different from each other. How many ways can you describe a line? Do you remember the terms we used?

Try to fill in each number with a type of line- it's ok if you don't get one for every number, you can go back and fill them in as you find them. If you find more types of lines than the numbers listed, then add more number to match the amount of lines you have:
